Associate Professor Yutaka Tanigawa, Graduate School of Letters, Kyoto University.

Dr. Yutaka Tanigawa studied at and received his PhD from Kyoto University. He was appointed assistant professor at the Institute for Research in Humanities and became an associate professor at the Graduate School of Letters, Kyoto University. His research in the field of modern Japanese history in particular focuses, based on Meiji-Period education and Buddhism, on questions of society, thought and politics, with an empirical approach that utilizes primary sources. Additionally, he is interested in the historical existence and transformation of intellectual authorities and the “transformability” of the human being. He stayed as visiting scholar at Harvard University in 2014 where he did research on historical records related to early Showa-period Christianity and collected respective archival material.
